This traineeship is an entry level technical position aimed at those invested in developing and sharing their making practice and technical knowledge through on the job training and hands-on learning.

Over the two year period the trainee will focus on developing their knowledge of making processes within the SSW facilities and explore the ways in which these skills are shared and disseminated through working directly with artists and going on to deliver workshops and taster courses.

The selected trainee will learn a wide range of technical skills across foundry, wood, metal and mould making. They will do this through supporting; the efficient and safe running of the SSW workshop facilities; artists on residency and open access; and





assisting workshop users with the realisation of their work, research and ideas. The trainee will also support on the maintenance of SSW facilities including general care of communal areas and grounds.

For nearly 40 years SSW has been a site for making and learning, empowerment and exchange, based in a belief that everyone brings unique and important skills to the workshop environment. The Technician Traineeship role is embedded in this ethos aiming to encourage and cultivate the selected candidate's making and teaching skills in order for them to go on and support the wider artistic, making and craft ecologies in Scotland and beyond. The traineeship also sets out to support the continuation of important and multiple pedagogies inherent in technician's roles and practice.

We look to open up this opportunity to people with a proven interest in SSW's activities, with a need to gain more experience before entering full employment. Previous holders of traineeships at SSW have gone on to undertake technician roles at Glasgow Sculpture Studios, Edinburgh College of Art, Edinburgh Sculpture Workshops as well as at commercial fabrication facilities and also teaching posts.
